**Message from Father Tom:**

“You are my servant...through whom I show my glory.”

I heard about a man once who was not particularly talented in any way; but he wanted to serve those around him. After getting done from work he would stop in the church and pray for a while. Then on his way walking back from work he might notice someone whose face was down, and offer a smile and an encouraging word.

On one such evening after grabbing some groceries, he noticed a downcast woman--an immigrant, he guessed from somewhere in Asia--blending into the crowd of people. Approaching her, he cheerfully pulled her out of her shell and got her to laugh a little. As he was about to leave, she asked hesitantly, “are you Jesus?” Surprised, the man said, “No, my name is Jim. Why would you think that.” Now a little embarrassed, she answered, “Since the loss of my husband, I have been really down for a long time: even to the point of thinking about suicide. I heard Jesus helps people and so I’ve been praying to Jesus for help. Somehow, you seem just like I imagined He would be.”

The prophet Isaiah speaks in one place about a “servant of God” through whom God will show his Glory. This person is the one whom history would call “the Christ”, the “Holy-Spirit-anointed-one”. Traditionally, we have always attributed this passage to Jesus: for the Father’s glory shone through Him so powerfully. But the amazing thing is that, like Jesus our Lord, all of us who are baptized receive the same Holy Spirit. It is for this reason that we are ALL Christians, or in other words, those anointed with the Holy Spirit.

So it is that for those who submit to the Holy Spirit in every aspect of our lives, we can become so much like Jesus that we are almost indistinguishable from Him. Sometimes I see this in students who frequently submit themselves in prayer. The other students start to recognize something different in them. These students have a holiness about them. They show forth the power and glory of God. May all of us be so filled with the Holy Spirit, so conformed to the life of Jesus, that others may mistake us and ask, “Are you Jesus”?

Some information on **Bishop-elect DeGroot** was born in rural Faribault, Minnesota on February 14, 1965 and raised on the family farm not far from there. He attended Catholic grade school in Faribault and graduated in 1983 from Bethlehem Academy Catholic High School, a school sponsored by the Sinsinawa Dominicans. He attended the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota, where his discernment of a priestly vocation led him to St. John Vianney College Seminary. After graduating from the University of St. Thomas with a B.A. in philosophy in 1987, he worked for several years in the business world, first as a shoe sales representative and manager, then for Land O’ Lakes as a feed specialist. During this time, he continued to be drawn to the idea of a priestly vocation. He entered the St. Paul Seminary in 1993, earned a Masters of Divinity, and was ordained to the priesthood by Archbishop Harry J. Flynn, May 31, 1997. He will be ordained Bishop and installed on February 13<sup>th</sup>.
