**Message from Father Tom:**

On December 27<sup>th</sup> every year, the Church celebrates the feast  
of the Holy Innocents. The Holy Innocents are the babies that  
were slaughtered when Herod was seeking to kill Jesus as a  
baby. Herod knew that there was a boy born within the last 2  
years in Bethlehem who was said to become the King. But he  
didn't know which one was the boy. Therefore, Herod killed *all*  
the children of Bethlehem under 2 years old.

We in the Church celebrate this feast of Holy Innocents  
because these children of Bethlehem were probably the first  
human beings in the world to die for the Lord Jesus. They were  
thus martyrs! Another way to put it is that they couldn't be  
distinguished from Jesus the King, so they were killed like  
Jesus would one day be killed. Oh, would that ALL of us were  
indistinguishable from Jesus our Lord!

But, as one author has pointed out, this may be one of the  
most pertinent feast days to our modern condition. How so?  
Well, we are more like Herod than we realize. Like Herod, we  
value our own kingship, our own autonomy so much, that we  
would rather deny--or even destroy--new life, than be required  
to sacrifice or give up some of that autonomy.

How often in our world do families use contraceptives or  
even abort children because "it isn't a good time for us right  
now."? Like Herod, we determine that new life is a threat to  
our way of life.

But this extends beyond the politicized debates about  
contraception and abortion. Being open to life is bigger than  
these issues. We also fail to be open to life every time that we  
choose our own comforts instead of taking care of the starving  
in Africa, or the homeless refugees of Syria. We fail to be open  
to new life every time we decide "I'm too busy to share the Lord  
Jesus with another person". As a result, the atheist doesn't  
receive new life in Baptism; the protestant Christian doesn't  
receive the new life of the Eucharist; the fallen away doesn't  
receive the new life of forgiveness in Confession. For almost  
all of us, we are Herod. We choose our own comfort and  
autonomy instead of choosing more life in the world. And if  
new life were to threaten our autonomy, we quickly try to kill it.

Awareness is always the first step in correcting our own  
faults. As we become aware of how we are not open to new  
life, we can in turn reject this evil within us. We can become  
people who welcome and encourage new life--either the  
physical life of new babies, or the spiritual life of new converts.

**Baby Bottles:** Right to Life will be giving baby bottles to  
elementary families. In the bottles they can put prayers to the  
unborn and also to families they are praying for. Help them  
celebrate the sanctity of life as a family in our parish.
