Father Tom's Teaching:

"I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly." -John 10:10

The March for Life has been going on for decades now, as people from all over the nation fight for the rights of the unborn. Certainly the Right to Life movement is primarily about ending abortion; but valuing life as a Catholic is a much bigger thing.

Valuing life means becoming less selfish. When a scared 20-something single mother chooses to give birth to and raise her new baby, it means that she has to give up a lot of other good things. She may not be able to wait for her dream job: she might have to take one that she doesn't care for. It might mean she no longer has time to go out to bars with friends. Being open to life means sacrifice for her. Yet, because of her sacrifice, new life is possible.

So too for us. Being open to life as a married person means being open to another child even when that is not convenient--even when it will mean we can't buy the new car or keep that subscription to Spotify. It may mean that we can't live as comfortably as someone with only one child. That trip to Cancun might be the price for being open to life--that is, open to God's will.

Even as a single person, a couple that can't have children, or even a celibate priest, we can be open to life by making time for those in need in our community: the homebound, our friends who have fallen away from the faith and need encouragement, the community organizations that need people to volunteer. Every time that we decide to use our money or time for ourselves--I'd rather stay in and watch Netflix--we are saying "no" to life in the community. Frequently, when a young person indulges him/herself with video games, he/she is saying "no" to new life.

But when we listen to the challenge of the Lord; when we pay attention to the Lord our God, it means sacrifice for us. It means new life for the world. Let's be truly pro-Life, by sacrificing our own desires so that others may have life, and have it to the full.
