Message from Father Tom:

All Christians in any state or walk of life are called to the fullness of Christian life and to the perfection of charity. All are called to holiness: “Be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect.” -Catechism #2013

One of the great things done at Vatican II, was to re-emphasize the universal call to holiness. People are called to one vocation among several: Priesthood, Religious Life, Marriage, or Single life. Yet *everyone* is called to holiness. It is God’s great desire that *you* be a saint. If this seems like a daunting task remember a couple things:

First, holiness does not mean becoming someone you are not. Holiness is becoming the one God made you to be--the best version of yourself. One of the strangest saints from history would have to be Simon the Stylite. This peculiar saint decided the best way for him to serve God was to go off out into the wilderness and sit on top of a pillar for the rest of his life. On the other side of things, we have St. Gianna Beretta Molla who died in 1962. A doctor and a mother, she is well known for the way she selflessly gave her life; so that her unborn child could live. Whatever type of person you are, whatever you do, you can do it united to Christ, in service of His will.

Second, holiness is in the little things. St. Therese of Lisieux lived life in an enclosed religious community. So did all her sisters who lived there in the convent. Therese was not distinguished by great deeds--there really wasn’t the opportunity for her to do great deeds--instead she was distinguished by the great love with which she did small deeds. Some of the greatest acts of love today are the sacrifices parents make for their children: often felt to be mundane and unimportant. But these are done so that kids, and others in need can live and prosper. Kimberly Hahn famously called the work of parents: “Saving the world, one diaper at a time.” Similarly, those of the single vocation can offer their time, talents, and treasures in ways that married people cannot.

Third, holiness may not be recognized. For one woman, the most heroic thing she can do is forgive her father. For another man, it may seem to be impossible to go on in life, but he makes an act of faith in the Lord, Jesus Christ. We may live on the street of a home-bound widow: unbeknownst to us, she prays day and night, as the saints of old. We don’t strive to be recognized by human powers but by our Father in heaven, who sees what is hidden.

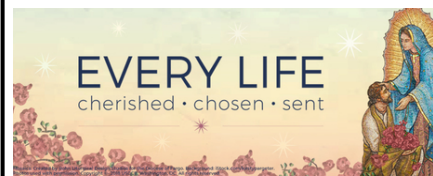
Finally, holiness is God’s gift to us. When all is said and done, we must remember that Faith, Hope, and Love are *gifts* from the heavenly Father. Jesus says, “how many times I yearned to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, but you were unwilling!” God will give us this gift if we ask for it regularly and cooperate with what He gives us. So let the saints come marching in!
