Message from Father Tom:

When tragic things happen in our lives there is so much hurt. The pain involved in losing a sister or a parent can be excruciating. I see this regularly as a priest. The most frequent question is “why”. “Why did this have to happen? Could I have done something to save my loved one?” **In the midst of all this pain, the demons creep in.** Shame. Gossip. Division. Blame. The evil spirits get into the mix and turn us from blaming ourselves to blaming others. “Why didn’t someone do something?”

One of the strategies of the evil spirits is division.

They love nothing better than to divide the faithful into little camps because they know that those who are divided are easier to conquer. Once divided, the different camps assume the worst of one another. They condemn people they used to call “friends”; and they will spread gossip and rumors against each other. The temptation will be to stop showing love and charity to people. The temptation will be to see the worst in everyone else. But, this is not the way of Christ!

“Who are you to pass judgment on the servant of another? It is before *his own* master that he stands or falls.” (Romans 14:4). You and I don’t have to judge and we shouldn’t judge...that’s the Father’s job. **Our job is to live in the love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ.**

Listen to what St. Peter says to us, “...all of you, have unity of spirit, sympathy, love of the brethren, a tender heart and a humble mind. Do not return evil for evil or reviling for reviling; but on the contrary bless, for to this you have been called...” (1 Peter 3:8-9). The way of Christ is to be with those who have suffered so much, regardless of who has brought about the suffering. The way of Christ is to pray for those who have wronged us--those who speak ill of us.

Beware, my dear sons and daughters; for the devil is prowling like a roaring lion seeking someone to devour. Resist him, solid in your faith and in your love for one another. **Resist with love and understanding, the one who brings division.**
