Message from Father Tom:

Bishop Swain retirement. Several weeks ago there was a program run on TV about our Bishop. Many have asked me if Bishop Swain is retiring. The unqualified answer is “yes, but probably not right away.” Every bishop is required to submit his resignation letter to the Pope upon turning 75 years old. However, until the Holy Father accepts his resignation, the bishop will remain in office.

As a consequence, Bishop Swain recently had his 75th birthday; and so he dutifully submitted his resignation. However, the Holy Father could accept his resignation tomorrow or 2 years from now. It is anyone’s guess. I encourage you all to pray for Bishop Swain in this twilight of his episcopacy and also to pray for whomever will succeed him.

Physician Assisted Suicide. As the elections approach in only a few weeks, we need to be prepared for what is going on in the world and in our state. This past year, there was a group in our state trying to get enough signatures to put “Physician-Assisted-Suicide” on the ballot for this fall. They failed. But they were too close for comfort. Such groups are trying to pass off the idea that some lives are not valuable: “My father couldn’t do anything anymore...he was no longer a productive member of society.” Such ideas are like poison. They suggest that we are the sum of what we can accomplish. But of course, we are so much more in God’s eyes--regardless of what we can accomplish.

Gender dysphoria and determining one’s own sex. Another hot-button topic is Gender Dysphoria. The person with Gender Dysphoria feels uncomfortable with his or her birth sex. This is not natural or healthy, but there is nothing evil about people feeling this way. In many cases they cannot help how they feel. The problem is that people are now trying to normalize and encourage these unnatural thoughts. I heard a story of a 7-year-old in Minnesota who came up to her friends and said, “Guess what, you can decide whether you are a boy or a girl.” We must be aware that there is a media campaign to change our children’s thoughts about this.

Religious Freedom. As many in the elite parts of our society become atheists, they have also become more prone to segmenting and isolating people of faith. Like perpetual teenagers, such people are uncomfortable having Christians around who might make them feel guilty. In order to deal with this, some in the court system have tried to redefine “freedom of religion”--protected by the 1st amendment--as “freedom of worship”. Although this may seem like a small change, it would have enormous consequences for us. The Lord never intended us to be Catholic Christians only one hour a week, or only when we are in the church building. Christ said, “Go out to all the world, baptizing and teaching...” So we need to be aware of these creeping changes.

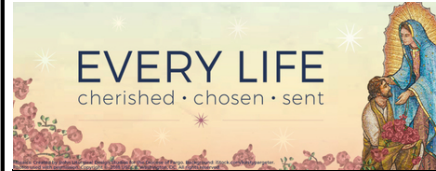

Some of us might be tempted to say, “Golly mister...I sure wish someone would do something about that.” Guess what, you and I are those people that need to do something. We need to be courageous in proclaiming the unchanging Gospel message in a chaotic world. This will mean teaching our families and communities. And in some cases, it will mean organizing our political action together.
