Message from Father Tom:

"We need to find God, and he cannot be found in noise and restlessness. God is the friend of silence. See how nature - trees, flowers, grass- grows in silence; see the stars, the moon and the sun, how they move in silence... We need silence to be able to touch souls." --Blessed Mother Teresa

Martin Scorsese has recently released a movie called "Silence" after the 1960's Japanese novel of Shusaku Endo by the same name. It tells the story of several Jesuit Catholic Missionary priests, who travel to Japan in the early 1600s to share their faith with the people of Japan and to find their lost priest mentor who is rumored to have apostatized (left or rejected his faith). They arrive in Japan. The tortures the ruling class has devised are as cruel as they are subtle--and they will all end, if only the priests will trample on a sacred image of Christ's face.

Scorsese has said on several occasions that a great work of art doesn't give answers as much as it asks good questions. One of the great questions that "Silence" asks is how are we to respond to the apparent silence of God, in the face of suffering. Do we give into the constant temptation to trample upon Christ, if it will take away the suffering.

Without giving away the ending of Silence, I would like to suggest that the mystery of the cross is precisely that God is *present in the silence*. He is present exactly where it feels like "God has abandoned us". When things are painful, we are tempted to step on Christ, to trample him, in order to get away from the pain. But it is precisely in the pain that Christ's cross is planted. It is here in the middle of painful things that we find Jesus waiting for us; and inviting us to join him on the cross.

This is very difficult to hear. We don't want to hear that our path to being with God is embracing the painful things. We don't want to hear that Christ dwells there. But for those who discover this mystery, they realize that there is an intimacy waiting for them that most others cannot dream of. "God is the friend of silence."
