Next week we will celebrate in a special Extraordinary Missionary Month. We are called through our baptism to be part of the Church's missionary efforts, through prayer, self-sacrifice and support of missionary vocations through material aid. Remembering that we are baptized and sent

**Message from Father Tom:**

*"Now is the hour! Riders of Rohan! Oaths you have taken, now fulfill them all, to lord and land" ~Lord of the Rings: Return of the King*

People think the second commandment--taking the Lord's name in vain--is about swearing. "Father, forgive me. I got angry a number of times in the past month and probably took the Lord's name in vain 15-20 times". Although we definitely shouldn't use Jesus' name irreverently, that is not what this commandment is truly about. So what does it mean to "take the Name of the Lord"? And what does it mean to take it "in vain"?

The 2nd commandment is all about taking oaths, in which God is called upon as a witness and judge. Take the following example. Imagine that Fred is a herder of sheep in Israel. He minds his P's and Q's, never getting into trouble, never stealing from other herds. But Cecil comes up to him claiming that Fred has stolen a prized sheep from him. Fred protests that he has not stolen it. To clear himself of blame he calls upon the name of the Lord to bear witness. He says, "As God is my witness, I did not steal the sheep. If I have spoken falsely, may God strike me down where I stand. I swear to God." Now Cecil is very aware of the stories of what God has done to people who take His name in vain. He heard last week about a man who had a heart attack while bathing. Therefore, he believes Fred, and walks away.

But now suppose that Fred was lying but he took the Lord's name anyway. Well then, he was taking the name of the Lord in vain. Not only is this a sin, but to take the Lord's name so lightly, so casually is a grave sin...one that he should confess right away lest he be judged and smitten down.

Saying the name of Jesus Christ or God when we are angry is definitely a venial sin. For whenever we are saying *the name* we are calling Him to be present, and we should never do so lightly. But to swear an oath on God's name falsely (to get out of something) is a grave sin and probably a mortal sin. That's why tradition in America has been to swear on a bible when giving testimony. People who lie after placing their hand on a bible are calling on the Bible (and the God of the Bible) to judge them for that lie.

So why take oaths at all? Why make vows or call upon God's name? First, as we have already said, when we are challenged on whether we are speaking truly, we may be believed when we call upon God's name. "I swear to God what I say is true."

The second reason, though, is that there is honor and even blessing in making a vow to God and keeping it. When a married couple keeps their vows year after year, they are honoring God and living in His blessing. When a monk keeps his vow of silence, he is living in God's blessing. When a man keeps his Lenten commitment not to eat meat on Fridays, he is living in the blessing of the Lord.

Friends, let us fulfill our vows and promises, so that in keeping them we may receive the Lord's blessing. But if we have failed to keep our word or to keep our vow, let us hasten to confession, least we deserve the Lord's wrath.

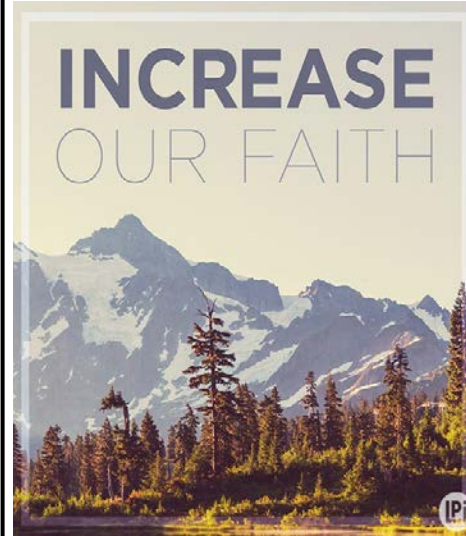
