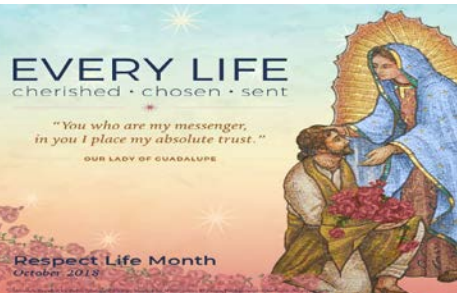

Message from Father Tom:

On Friday, October 4th, we celebrated a great Saint of the Church--Saint Francis of Assisi. Known for his great love of Christ which in turn led him to give away all of his wealth, he lived like a beggar throughout his life. He is also the saint after whom our current Holy Father is named. In our faith there are several different motives for giving things away and living generously. For the sake of discussion, I will call this a movement toward poverty.

First, there is the movement toward poverty for the sake of the other. Our many gifts of time, money, or talent may belong to us; but these gifts are intended to be used for the sake of all. Francis understood this well. He was born with great wealth, but others needed these things more. We heard about this very powerfully from Christ only last weekend. The rich man should have given away some of his wealth, simply because Lazarus needed it! And because the rich man didn't give Lazarus something, he was punished accordingly in the next life. The question that we must always answer is, "why has the Lord God given me these gifts?" Is it for the sake of your family? For the poor around you? For the community?

Second, there is the movement toward poverty for the sake of our own personal freedom. This is a (somewhat) selfish motive. We are fundamentally happier and we have greater freedom, the fewer things we have...the more that we rely on God for everything. For everything that we own, owns us. The boat that I own requires me to pay for it, to repair it, and to store it when not in use. These are preoccupations/distractions that the poor man does not have. Saint Francis had a freedom to be able to go anywhere and help anyone; for he was not held down by the obligations that his wealthy father had. Granted, some are called for a variety of reasons to own things that impede on their freedom--perhaps so that they can serve others better. But we must understand that owning these things *is* a burden and may even be an obstacle for eternal life if used incorrectly.

Finally, there is the movement toward poverty for the sake of imitating Christ. One of the strange things about our faith is that the wealthiest One of all (our God and Lord Jesus Christ) didn't choose to remain wealthy. Instead He emptied himself of everything and humbled himself to be born as a weak little baby, in a poor little family, in a backwater part of the world, being almost completely unknown to anyone important. More than anything, Saint Francis wanted to be like his Lord Jesus Christ. And if poverty and persecution was good enough for Jesus it was good enough for Francis. Even today, this is perhaps the greatest motivation for us to live simply. We want to live like Jesus did! Let us imitate St. Francis, who had so much to teach us about "Lady Poverty".
