**Message from Father Tom:**

In truth, most of us will not go directly to heaven. Most people will spend a fair amount of time in purgatory getting purified before they enter into heaven. Just the same as you wouldn't appear at a beautiful wedding banquet without first cleaning up your hands, and changing your clothes; so too, humans can't appear at the wedding feast of the lamb until they have first had a chance to get cleaned up.

Yet, we should recognize this for what it is: a great mercy! God could have done it another way. He could have outright decided that anyone with any stain or impurity still on their souls would immediately go to hell upon death. Or alternatively, God could have allowed people with filthy souls and bodies to enter into his presence. But this would be embarrassing for the person to appear this way, and it would be unfitting for the dignity of our Lord.

Instead the Lord grants people this "antichamber" of heaven. Those in purgatory may suffer to some extent. But we humans are no strangers to suffering. Some people are purified by suffering here on earth; while others are purified by their sufferings in purgatory. Unlike hell, which is permanent, purgatory is only temporary. And there is only one direction people go from purgatory--up! Gradually, as a person is purified of their sinful attachments, they become lighter and lighter until they practically ascend into heaven as Jesus our Lord or the Blessed Mother.

Scripture and tradition indicate that we can help those in purgatory by our prayers and expiatory sacrifices (see 2 Mac 12:39-45). For this reason, every year on All Souls Day and throughout the month of November, we take the opportunity to pray for our beloved dead. Eternal rest grant unto them of Lord: and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in peace.

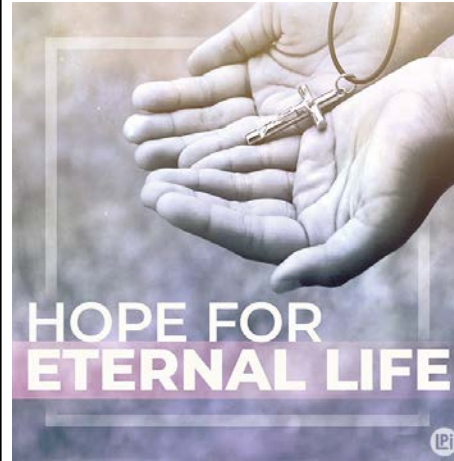
