Message from Father Tom:

Having lived in the Roman Empire in the 4th and 5th century, Saint Augustine certainly lived in challenging times. The Empire showed a number of signs of decay: corruption, unmaintained buildings, and a variety of unnatural practices had become commonplace. To add insult to injury, the Visigoths--a people considered by the Romans to be very backward--had sacked Rome in the year 410. It seemed to the Romans that the world that they knew and the empire that they loved, were crumbling. In many ways Rome was like their motherland. How could they go on without it?

St. Augustine suggested that in God's creation there are two cities, by which he meant to civilizations or kingdoms to which we may belong. There is the city/kingdom of man, and the city/kingdom of God. The kingdom of man can be exciting and lovely. But it will rise and fall and we shouldn't become too attached to it. On the contrary, the Kingdom of God is spiritual and eternal. It is populated by the people who consider Christ their King. Augustine suggested we should keep our eyes fixed on the Kingdom of God, especially in the midst of affliction and when it seems that our world is crumbling.

There are so many excellent and wonderful things around us today...and yet, I always remember that empires not only can, but do inevitably fall. Our great nation, founded on the principles of freedom, moral behavior (and yes on faith in the Christian God) may start to decay as the glorious Rome did so many centuries before us. For our part, we need to fight for whatever is good in the city of man; but with the realistic understanding that, when all is said and done, only the City of God, the Church, the heavenly Jerusalem, will ultimately remain.
