**Message from Father Tom:**

After this I had a vision of a great multitude, which no one could  
count, from every nation, race, people, and tongue. They cried  
out in a loud voice: "Salvation comes from our God, who is  
seated on the throne, and from the Lamb."  
-Revelations 7

Around this time of year I try to show one of the exorcism  
movies that comes out. I'm not much of a fan of scary movies,  
to be honest. But I like that it shows in a very visible way all  
the things that are normally left to our imagination. Demons  
are real; so are angels; so are saints; so are our dead relatives  
being purified in Purgatory. And as it turns out, they are  
separated from us only by a thin veil.

On the campus of St. Thomas University up in the twin  
cities, the seminarians had a custom that on All-Saints day,  
November 1st, they would go around and write on the sidewalk  
all over campus the names of different saints: St. Charles, pray  
for us...St. Lawrence, pray for us...St. Catherine, pray  
for us...so on and so on. Everywhere people went that day, they  
were reminded that the saints are among us and we can ask  
them to pray for us. The invisible could almost be grasped, for  
just a moment.

November is a month dedicated to Last Things: Heaven,  
Hell, Death, and Judgement (I might add Purgatory for our  
purposes). Let us take the opportunity to reflect on the invisible  
world around us.

And, recalling the mercy which God our Father has shown to us, we also ask that, through our words and actions, they may encounter the outstretched hands of his mercy.
