**Message from Father Tom:**

I have a confession to make...I don't particularly like to vote. I am often disheartened by the messiness of politics; and I am haunted by the sense that little good gets done. However, I always do.

Throughout the centuries the Church has had to decide what relationship it will have with the world. Some in the Church are very optimistic. They represent one extreme about our relationship with the world: they believe that we can achieve a type of utopia if we press hard enough for change. The other extreme are those who have lost faith in the world: they believe that we might as well withdraw from the world--for in their minds the world is going to hell in a handbasket anyway. The consistent answer from the Church and from the Lord has been to avoid both extremes. We must never believe that heaven can be fully realized here on earth. However, we are a part of this world; and therefore, we have an obligation to engage and transform the world. One of the ways that that translates for us is voting!

So, assuming we have educated ourselves, we ought to vote. How do we choose what's important? When it comes our relationship with the world (and voting) we have to be mindful of Christian principles and prioritize the importance of these issues. Some issues are inherently more important than others.

1. Protection of life. The most important issue is the protection of life--from those in the womb to those nearing their death and in danger of Euthanasia. If people don't have life, it makes no sense to talk about anything else in their regard.
2. Generation and nurturing of new life. The second most important class of issues are those connected with the future of our civilization, namely marriage, family structure, procreation, and education in virtue. There must be strong marriages and families in order for civilization to thrive. This also includes the education in faith and right living. Often, when we take care of this, the quality of life (below) improves automatically.
3. Quality of life. The comfort of people is truly important. We should indeed worry about those who are poor, sick, and in any other need. However, the comfort that people experience in life, is less important than other issues. Our voting should reflect this.

Finally, although voting and all government is important, it cannot substitute for our own struggle with society's needs around us. Pope Francis has been a great example to us all in that he doesn't wait for the government to take care of things--he will take care of the poor, or defend human life whenever the need arises. We, indeed, should do our part to shape the government and society; but we are never off the hook when it comes to taking care of those who are on our doorstep. Although it is tempting to think that it is someone else's problem or that the government will take care of it, we must always care for our neighbors in need.
