

Message from Father Tom:

Not long ago Pope Emeritus Benedict made an astute observation. The Church has three missions: first, prayer and worship; second, care for the poor (broadly understood as anyone in need); and third, evangelization and the spreading of the knowledge and love of Christ. Benedict commented that if any of these three missions was absent, the Church would be a deformed, incomplete version of herself: in fact she would cease to truly be what she is called to be. So for example, if the Church were ever in the position where she carried out worship service and talked about people becoming Catholic, but she didn't take care of the poor, she would end up in hypocrisy (like Pharisees). If worship/prayer isn't present, then the Church is just like one more secular do-good institution (the Rotary or the Red Cross). Finally, if evangelization isn't present in the Church--and people are scared or ashamed to talk about Jesus--then the Church withers and dies from old age.

Saint John Bosco was a saint of the 19th century in Italy who dedicated his life to the education and betterment of street children. Like Boy's Town in Omaha, his religious order sought to treat these boys as if they were their own sons.

Like many other saints, John Bosco was a great example of a man fully committed to all three missions of the Church. He was a dedicated man of prayer and worship. He cared for the poor--particularly in the boys who lived on the streets. He saw Christ in these dirty, neglected Children and served Christ in them. And finally, he was evangelistic. He knew that the most important change in the lives of these young boys was knowing and loving Jesus Christ. Therefore, his order was dedicated to helping them get to heaven.

Which of these three missions do you have the most difficulty with? Helping those in need around you? Teaching or evangelizing about Jesus and the Church with others? Giving God his due through worship and by avoiding sin? Let us be about all three missions of the Church!

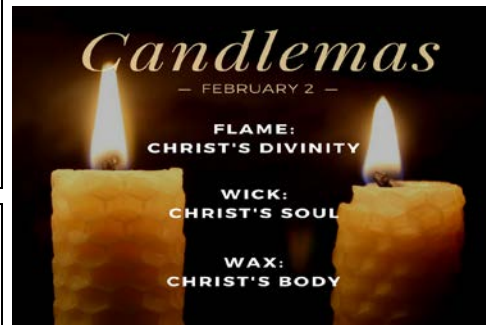

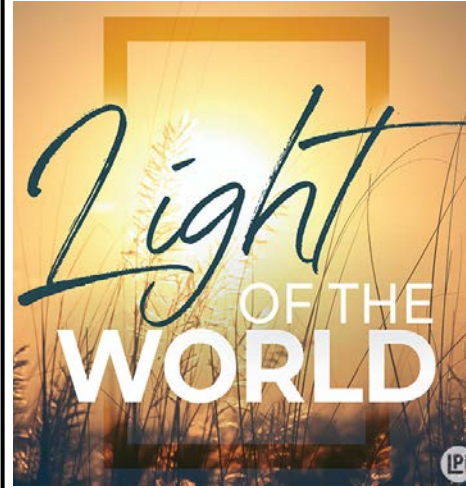
