Message from Father Tom:

Dave Ramsey is a radio personality who is probably best known for helping callers become and remain debt free. In a world where not all learned how to manage money, Dave's "Financial Peace University" is a great blessing. Through listening to him, I learned important things like having an "emergency" account; I learned about cutting up my high interest credit cards; and, of course, I learned that if you want to live like nobody else, (Cont. on next column)

(Cont.) sometimes you have to live like nobody else...eating rice and beans until you get out of debt. But aside from good financial advice, I've always liked how Dave Ramsey replied to his callers who asked him, "how are you doing?" He, invariably, would respond, "Better than I deserve."

Strange as it may seem, "how are you?" may just be one of the most complicated questions. How should we respond? Should we tell him the truth: "I'm really worried about being able to keep my farm because of the prices."--no, that's more information than he wants to know. Should we lie and say that we are good, even though we are really grieving about a relative who just died --well I hate the idea of lying to someone, even if it is a white lie.

In the confessional I get a good picture of how people look at themselves; how they might respond to "how are you?". The very process of going to confession requires a self-analysis. But people whose self-examination goes to extremes, do so in one of two very different ways. Either (A) they don't understand their littleness, their weakness, their sinfulness; or (B) they know their weakness, but despair of God's goodness.

The first group of people often come with the following line: "I'm basically a good person, but I suppose I could..." They think they are 90% "there"; and the last little bit of sin they still have is brought on more by others than their own sinfulness. However, it's important for these people to know that there is a big difference between being socially acceptable, and being holy. One may be the envy of the town, but entirely ignorant of God and of love. We are all sinners. One of the psalms says, "the just man sins 7 times a day." For people who have a difficult time knowing their own sinfulness, I would recommend thinking not about what you have done wrong (there may be few things you can think of), but about what you have failed to do. There are so many things we have failed to do. God asks for our whole heart--can we see how many times a day we place ourselves before God?

The second group of people are the flip side of this. They too think that they can be saints by their own power...but they are overwhelmed to realize how completely they have failed to do so. Perhaps because their sins are *socially unacceptable*, they know too well their failure. And because they think that their sins are their own responsibility, they despair. "I'm a failure. God could never love someone like me." People in this category might consider which voice speaks in this way--it is the evil spirit that wants us to believe that things are hopeless, that God's love is unattainable. Our Father in heaven, on the other hand, always gives us a way out.

The proper attitude for people-of-faith is, "I am far better than I deserve". As I confess my sins, I realize just how weak, powerless, sinful, and cold that I am. I realize that I really deserve to be punished and expelled from God's presence. But then I look to the Lord and see how generously He treats me. He says, "I absolve you of your sins...go and sin no more." He looks upon us with love and mercy. When we can accept both sides of our situation--we deserve little, but we have been given much--our response to the casual "how are you" might be like Dave Ramsey: *I'm better than I deserve!*
