## Father Tom's teaching:

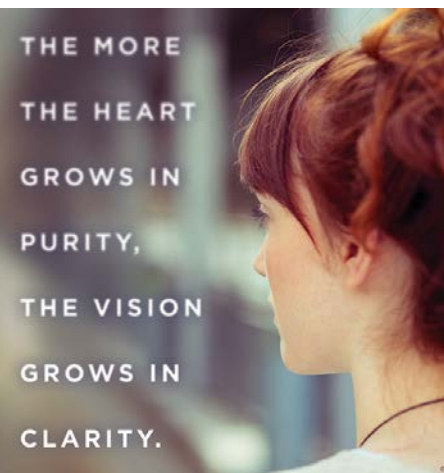
Pete was unloved at home. He was put upon by the police. His boss was being unfair. He had no friends to turn to. Truly this man had suffered in his life in ways I could not understand. Time after time, his outlet was to run away to someplace less unpleasant, or to numb the pain with drugs. Unlike many others in treatment, Pete really didn't seem all that physiologically dependent on the drugs. After all, he had a number of times in life where he was "sober" for months and even years. However, like so many others, his life was characterized by lies to himself and others; running away from painful circumstances instead of trying to deal with them.

Personally, I don't know what I would've done in the same circumstance: I am a weak man, like any other. But I do know, from observing human nature, that people never recover from the pain and sorrow of life until they learn to face it...to deal with it.

At a certain point in Jesus' public ministry, it says that he turned decisively toward Jerusalem (toward the place of his crucifixion), setting his face like flint. It was terribly important for Him that He face the reality of his pain and suffering head on. For this destiny was the will of the Father. Jesus didn't blame the Pharisees for what would happen to Him; He didn't run away, He didn't try to distract Himself from the mission by drinking, eating, or playing games. Instead He went to prayer. He simply said, "Lord if it is possible, let this cup pass; but not my will, but yours be done." Then He went to His death.

Let us be on guard for any behavior that avoids responsibility, and even that avoids difficult things because they are difficult. Instead, let us go to prayer as Christ did--He took His pain and anguish to His heavenly Father. If there is one thing that characterizes the true Saint, the true disciple of Christ, it is their capacity to allow God into the filth and ugliness of life, and to receive love even there.
