**Message from Father Tom:**

“Have you been saved?” ask our non-Catholic brothers and sisters. And when it is asked, Catholics everywhere clam up because they know they *shouldn’t* say yes; but perhaps they feel a little bitter that they can’t. Catholics are right to hold off from saying yes, unequivocally. Probably the best response out there is, “Not yet. I am working out my salvation with fear and trembling and hope to be saved!” But why can’t we just say “Yes. I have been saved”?

**This question reflects a great confusion between the concepts of “justification/ redemption” on the one hand and “salvation” on the other.** In St. Paul and in the Catholic tradition these are two very different concepts. Redemption is a legal concept. Father John Hardon, SJ says: “Literally, to redeem means to free or buy back. Humanity was held captive as to a debt of punishment, to the payment of which it was bound by divine justice. On all these counts the Passion of Christ was sufficient and superabundant satisfaction for human guilt and the consequent debt of punishment.” Since this buy-back by Christ covers all sins and all debts, then we can say that all mankind is *redeemed* objectively and legally speaking.

However, in many places in the same revelation, we hear Jesus say that the road is wide that leads to destruction. He says, “he that shall *persevere to the end*, he shall be saved”. The apostles, likewise, when talking about salvation almost always use conditional statements or probability statements like “might be saved” or “should be saved” or “if this happens...one can be saved”. This indicates that salvation is something we are as-yet unsure of; and we will remain so until the point of our death. **So redemption is something that Christ accomplished once for all; but salvation is something that we hope for and work for, for the future.**

**It is important for Catholics to remember that this salvation is not something that we can accomplish by ourselves either.** Non-Catholics are right in challenging Catholics about saving themselves...we can’t save ourselves. We need God’s grace. And we receive this grace through the Sacraments and a life lived for Christ. So let us hope for our salvation in the Lord Jesus and “work out our salvation with fear and trembling” (Philippians 2:12)

**Prayer of Hope**

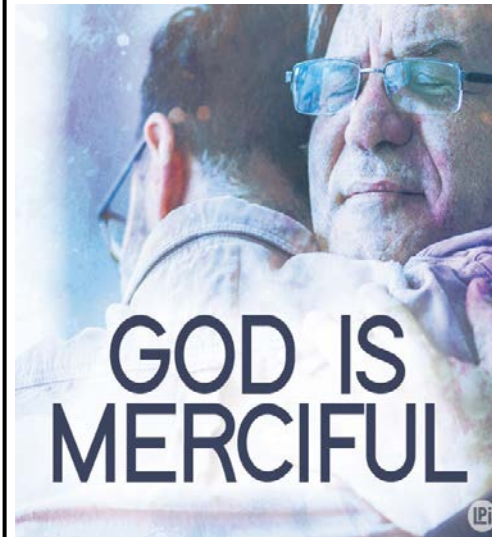
