What is an Octave? An octave is the eight-day period during which Easter or Christmas is celebrated, and includes the actual feast. The eighth day is also called the octave or "octave day," and days in between are said to be "within the octave"

Father Tom's teaching:

"He is Risen, He is Risen, Indeed!"

It is a strange thing that we say on Easter...that 'He is alive'. Why don't we say 'He was alive again after He died'. Or 'He came back to life for a little while'? Unlike the latter two, the first phrase indicates that **Christ is still alive now.**

And to be alive indicates that Christ has a body. I think sometimes we imagine that Jesus our Lord is, at best, a nebulous cloud of presence around us. Or perhaps we think that if we were to ever see Him, it would be like seeing a ghost. This is not what scripture indicates. Our Lord Jesus went to great lengths to show that He wasn't a ghost. He ate fish with the apostles on several occasions.

Does that mean that Christ is like some type of zombie running around? By no means. Jesus' body is indeed the body that He had on this earth. But this resurrected body is stronger and fuller and more powerful after the resurrection. The resurrected Body of Christ is FULL of life because Jesus IS life. The body of our Lord (in fact the fullness of Jesus Christ) appeared to the disciples on the road; and to the women; and to St. Paul; and to the apostles in the upper room. **He appears everywhere, He affects everything.**

That means that He could step into your own kitchen today, dirty dishes and all (or your dorm room) just as readily as He stepped into the upper room with the apostles 2000 years ago...strange thought. Today I might see my Lord appear to me and He might even choose to eat with me. To believe that Christ is risen means that **we believe that Christ still impacts the world each and every day.** He guides and directs our lives.

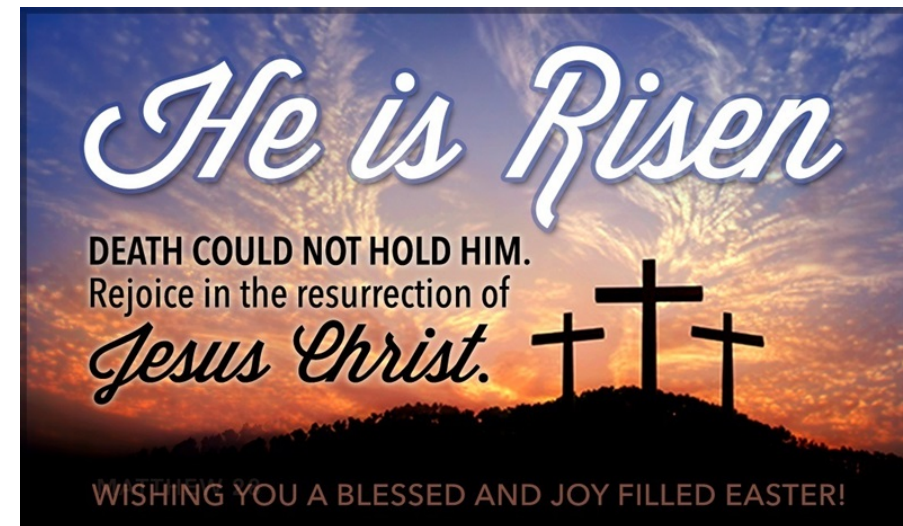
