Message from Father Tom:

*So they said to him, "Who are you?"
Jesus said to them, "What I told you from the beginning.
I have much to say about you in condemnation.
But the one who sent me is true,
and what I heard from him I tell the world."
-John 8*

I have no doubt whatsoever that it would've been hard to accept Jesus as God. After all, how readily do we believe someone today who says such thing? Yet, if someone heard Jesus say, "before Abraham came to be, I AM" I would be surprised if he didn't get goose bumps.

These are the type of readings that we hear as we approach Holy Week and the Triduum liturgies. Jesus meet with the Jews in the temple area. Jesus and "the Jews"--who representing all humanity, all the people of God--are in dialogue together. We are meant to see not a man in dialogue with a crowd; but **God in dialogue with his people.** Jesus speaks as God come among us, and so He has a heavenly perspective. The people have a very earthly perspective, and so they are indignant at being reprimanded. Jesus points out that they do not know where he comes from or to where he is going. They think they understand that He is from Nazareth; but in reality, He is from heaven and returning to there.

So He says to all of humanity, as one who was with you in the beginning, I have much to say about you in condemnation... The Lord God, in his last days here on earth, puts His people on trial. He points to humanity's unbelief, our selfishness. He points out our cruelty and indifference. We say, "We have no king but Caesar".

Worst of all, after He has completed His recitation of our sins, **we do not repent, but instead seek to kill Him.** "Crucify Him, Crucify Him". Instead of admitting our guilt, we would rather have someone else die in our place. "Crucify Him, Crucify Him". Instead of asking to free the just and innocent King, we ask for Barabbas--who represents rebellious humanity--to be freed. "We want Barabbas".

And the strangest thing is, **Our Lord Jesus, God become man, accepts our abuse of Him.** "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." Oh, how fickle we are; and how faithful is the Lord to all of us. Let us week for the incredible love and mercy that God has shown to us.
