**Father Tom's teaching:**

Many years ago when I attended the extraordinary (Latin) mass for the first time, I was struck by some of the things that it taught me about our current way of celebrating the mass. In light of Father Mark Axtmann's celebrating this liturgy for us; I thought it might be helpful to highlight some (Cont.)

(Cont.) of my own takeaways from the old form of the mass.

First, silence at the mass is a great gift. In an age filled with so much noise, the old Latin mass has so much space for quiet, for meditation, for contemplation before the living God. This silence is both auditory and, to some degree, visual. Although we can hear sounds, we rarely hear intelligible words. And even if we do hear intelligible words there is a silence of visuals too--often we can't see what Father Axtmann is doing. In the silence, God speaks and we can hear just a little better. One of the things that make this mass so profound is the opportunity to hear that which we don't usually hear. Having learned this from the old mass, I try to bring more silence into the current mass.

Second, this old mass makes clear what is true of the new mass but is less obvious: namely, the mass is a prayer to the Father. Coming to the Latin mass, I was trying to figure out why it seemed so prayerful. The answer came to me that I wasn't thinking about the priest...I was thinking about the Heavenly Father. In so many of the liturgies today, the focus is all on the externals: the homily, the priest's personality, the choir's latest music number. In the old mass, everything is turned to God (even the priest). The Latin words are not meant to please the ears of the congregation, but to please the ears of God. The chant mass is nothing like what we would choose to listen to on the radio; instead we play a music that can easily follow scripture word-for-word. I love the fact that this liturgy is plainly for the Lord and not for humans. Having seen how everything in the old liturgy was turned to the Father, I strive to find ways to draw our attention away from the priest, and to the Father in Heaven.

Third, through participating in the extraordinary form mass, I discovered that it's okay if we don't understand everything that is going on. One of the frustrations of the old Latin mass is that you don't know word-for-word what's going on. But strangely, one seems to get a better sense of the big picture of what is going on. Because I *can't* focus on the trees, I don't miss the forest for the trees. In the second half of the mass, it seems so much clearer that we are offering the sacrifice of the Son (Jesus) to the Heavenly Father. It seems in many ways, like it doesn't matter that the priest is silent in this part, because I know that he is offering the sacrifice for me and everyone else. Furthermore, I'm offering my heart and my sacrifice to the Father with the priest's offering. Thus, in celebrating our mass today in English, I'm more aware of these big movements of the liturgy, instead of getting caught up in the line-by-line prayers.

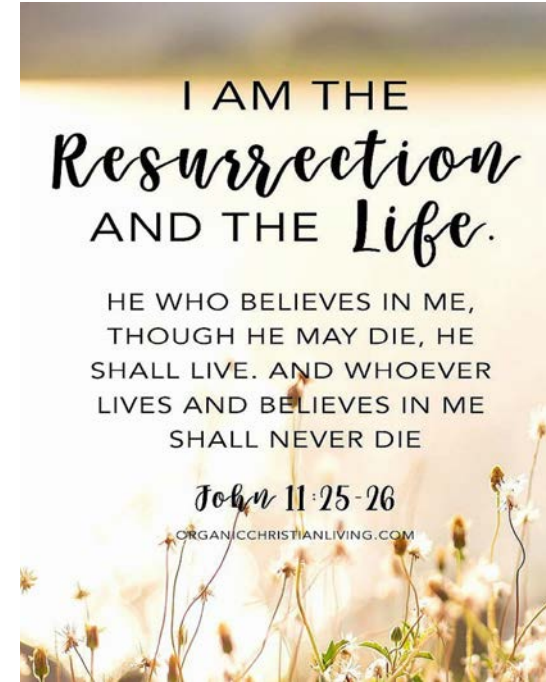
