Message from Father Tom:

"If then you were raised with Christ, [live your new life]". -Col. 3:1

Easter Sunday has always been the time when new Catholics come into the Church. But why does the Church associate becoming Catholic with Easter? It seems that people could just as easily become Catholic in July or in October. Why on Easter Sunday?

In order to understand we must remember that Christians are called to be united to Christ in everything. Everything in our faith is about being united with our Lord Jesus. We are called to walk with Him. We are called to listen to Him. We are even called to die, and be "born again" with Him" to new life. As with everything in the Church, where Christ has gone, so we also must go!

But before we are ready to follow him, we must let go of everything that is holding us back. In other words we must die to our old way of life, in order to begin a new life with Him. So, even though the death and resurrection of Jesus were some of the last things that Christ did, they are also the first things that we must do in our journey to salvation.

A young woman who came into the Catholic Church recently, truly had to die to her old way of life. Her family hates the Catholic Church and has practically disowned her. Of course she didn't want to lose her family. But she believed with all her heart that becoming Catholic was what Christ was calling her to do. She essentially had to let go of everything that she held onto in the past: her family, her friends, and even some opportunities that she might have had.

This death to her old way of life was symbolized and sacramentalized at the Easter Vigil when she was baptized. In the waters of baptism she let go of her old life in order to live a new one. In the early days of the Church, Catechumens would remove all their clothes before descending into the water. They would burn their old clothes, and after coming out of the water, would put on a white garment symbolizing their new, purified life.

Friends, though many of us were baptized when we were infants, we made the same sort of agreement with the Lord. We agreed that we would not live the lives of corruption and filth that most of the world lives. Instead we would burn those clothes representing a worldly life in order to live completely the life of Jesus...the life of justice and purity.

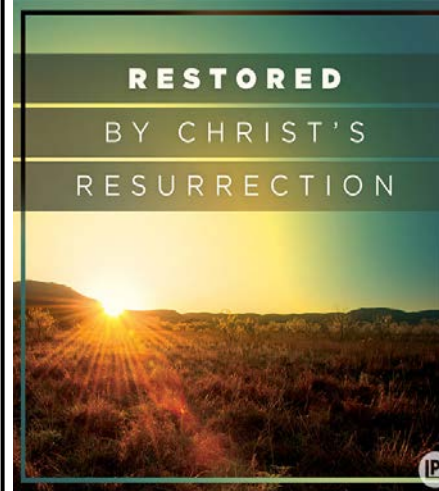
When we come to our Easter celebration today, let us not forget what we have rejected in order to follow Christ. It means that our old lives are over--crucified with Christ on Good Friday. And now our new lives, united with Christ, must begin.
