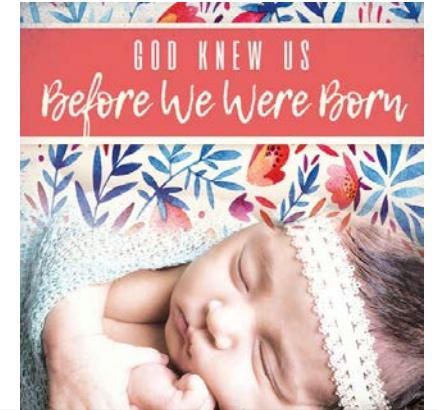
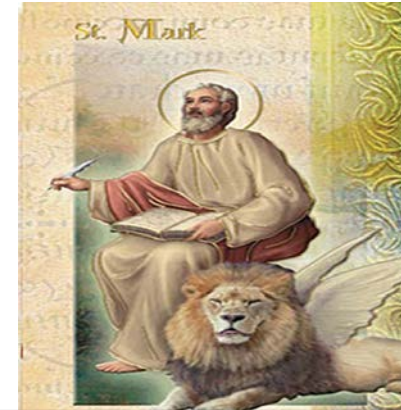

Sacrament of Baptism
May be celebrated during Sunday Mass or midday on Sunday outside Mass. A class is required prior to the Baptism of your child.

Daily Mass will be said, even if there is a funeral.

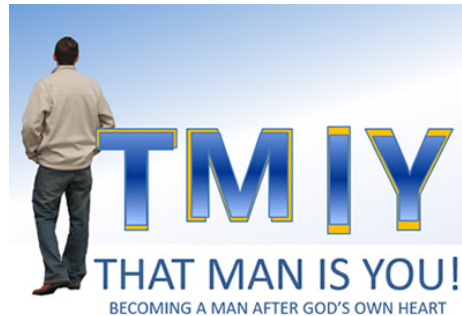
Father Tom's teaching:

"There is no salvation through anyone else, nor is there any other name under heaven given to the human race by which we are to be saved."

There has always been something radical about the claims of the Judeo-Christian tradition. Even in the OT, our ancestors in the faith proclaimed that there was only one God and that all the gods of other nations were, in fact, just statues or other worthless idols. I can imagine how that came across to the Canaanites: "are you saying our gods are nothing!?" The Israelites might have responded, "pretty much".

Today the Church follows after St. Peter in proclaiming that only in our Lord Jesus can anyone in the whole world be saved; and only in the Church have the knowledge and traditions of Christ been kept secured.

Is this hard to accept? No harder than it is to accept that God has revealed who He actually is to the world. No harder than it was for the Jews to accept that Jesus was the name by which all are saved.

Vocation Teaching: This is World Day of Prayer for Vocations. The world needs worthy leaders, Good Shepherds of the 20th Century, caring, unselfishly for the needs of God’s people. Please, pray for vocations.

The purpose of the **World Day of Prayer for Vocations** is to publically fulfill the Lord’s instruction to, “Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest” (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). As a climax to a prayer that is continually offered throughout the Church, it affirms the primacy of faith and grace in all that concerns vocations to the priesthood and to the consecrated life. While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates its attention this day on vocations to the *ordained ministries* (priesthood and diaconate), to the *Religious life* in all its forms (male and female, contemplative and apostolic), to *societies of apostolic life*, to *secular institutes* in their diversity of services and membership, and to the missionary life, in the particular sense of *mission “ad gentes”*. World Day of Prayer is observed on Sunday, April 22, also known as “Good Shepherd Sunday.” 2018 marks the **55th Anniversary** of the World Day of Prayer for Vocations
