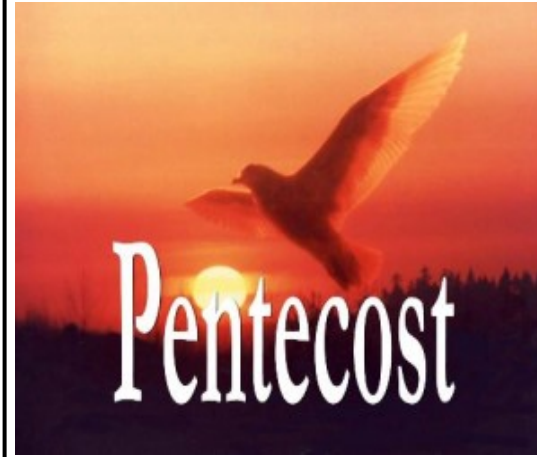


# Pentecost Sunday

## May 20, 2018



Happy birthday to the Catholic Church! Happy birthday to you, who are the body of the Church! Pentecost is the Church's birthday, and yours as well. And like any birthday, it's a cause for celebration. The word Pentecost is Greek and it means "50th day." Fifty days after Easter Sunday, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and their followers, and the beginning of their Earthly ministry to make disciples of all nations.

### Father Tom's teaching:

Unlike many other great feasts, Pentecost does not follow with its own season. Christmas has its own season; Easter has a whole 50 days of an Easter season. But Pentecost doesn't. Instead, the very next day after we celebrate Pentecost, we immediately go into "Ordinary Time". Ordinary time sounds so ordinary--not exciting.

Yet, it is the nature of Pentecost to come into the ordinary. It is the nature of the Holy Spirit to take the ordinary and make it extraordinary! When the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles at Pentecost, 12 very ordinary men started to speak different languages. These ordinary men healed people and fed thousands. They spoke boldly and even went to their martyrdoms.

I think there is an important lesson here. Yes, we move into "ordinary time". But, the point the Church is trying to make is that, with the Holy Spirit in us, there is nothing ordinary about this time for us. We are a Pentecost people. We are a people who are infused with the Holy Spirit. So all our ordinary actions in our ordinary lives are infused with the extraordinary.

You have been given the gift of the Spirit...be extraordinary during this ordinary time.

**Ordinary Time** comprises two periods: one beginning on the day after the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (the end of the Christmas season) and ending on the day before Ash Wednesday, the other beginning on the Monday after Pentecost (the end of the Easter season) and continuing until the Saturday before the First Sunday in Advent. These periods of time combined are the longest time in the liturgical year. The weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. Several Sundays bear the name of feasts or solemnities celebrated on those days, included Trinity Sunday and the Feast of Christ the King. The Liturgical Color is green – symbolizing life and hope. Christmas Time and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely, the incarnation, death and resurrection, and ascension of Jesus, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ. Ordinary Time is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

**At Pentecost**, the Apostles and their followers were gathered in a room. Jews from all over the world were gathered with Peter, the leader of the Apostles and the Eleven. At this time, a great wind blew and a flame appeared as a tongue of fire, which split itself into many individual flames above the heads of all those present. The Holy Spirit came upon these people and each began to speak in tongues. Despite the fact many had no common language, they were perfectly able to understand one another.
