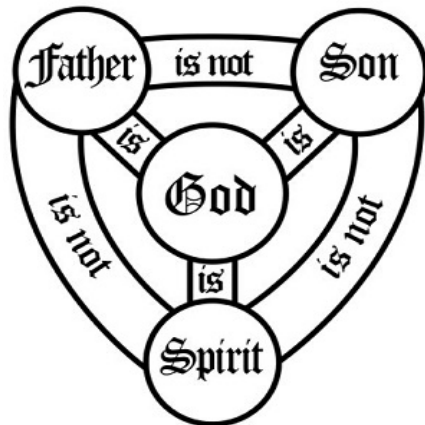

Message from Father Tom:

Dear friends, for several years now--before my time here--the parish council has been considering whether it is time to build a new rectory. When I arrived, this was already something people were bringing to my attention. At first, I didn't know why this was a priority. But after living in the rectory for a year, I can understand these thoughts.

The rectory is a beautiful building with many great features: the woodworking is amazing; the high ceilings and big windows very comforting. My understanding is that when the current house was purchased by the parish, Father Fox intended it to be more than a rectory: it was almost going to be a seminary. It would be a place where young men could come and be formed. Today our needs are very different. The current rectory no longer works well for the needs of our parish and our priests. For one thing, we no longer need to house many young men together for seminary formation.

Probably the biggest reason we need a change is accessibility. I am a young priest, in relatively good health. But for any priest older than me, the stairs in the current rectory would be a major problem on a day to day basis. For example, Father Bill Osborn graciously offers to come back to Redfield to substitute for me; but, because of his mobility issues, he has no shower accessible to him. Add to that the other problems, such as heating and cooling the house, and one's perspective starts to shift. I'm convinced that unless we explore our options, we are not being good stewards of the church, or stewards of our future priests. If I can help make things easier for your next priest; that seems the least I can do for the future of St. Bernard's.

Because of these things, we on the staff, and on the parish council are starting the process. We are making plans and asking for bids with the understanding that many things could still stop or slow the process. The Bishop may tell us there is good reason to hold off. The parish may discover other better options that we have not considered. We may discover that no builders are available right now. But we will not know these things until we start to move along this path.

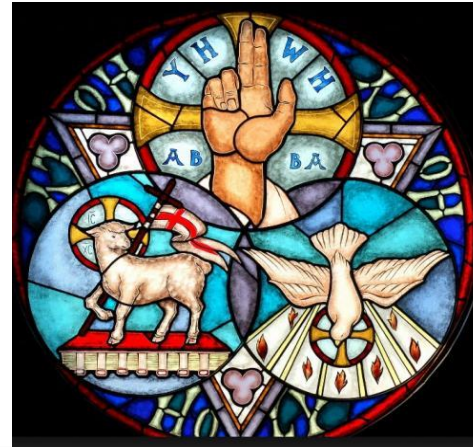
Should this go forward, we intend to build the new rectory on the current site. Therefore, we need your help. **Please pass on the word that we are looking for people interested in the current rectory building.** It is a good house, in very good shape for its age. We are willing to part from the house for free--the buyer would pay for the moving costs. Also, pray for wisdom for me and the parish council: that we will make wise decisions for the future of our parish.

Commentary for the Readings in the Extraordinary Form: Trinity Sunday

"Blessed be the Holy Trinity" (Introit) "in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" (Gospel). The Most Adorable Trinity! "All things" good, in nature and grace, flow from and return to the Trinity; "from Him," God the Father, our Creator; "through Him," God the Son, our Redeemer; "unto Him," God the Holy Spirit, our Sanctifier (Epistle).

May we ever be "on the alert" to the presence of the Trinity in our souls! At Baptism we became the adopted "sons of the Father," "co-heirs with Christ," "temples of the Holy Spirit!"

In our offering of Holy Mass, "we will give glory to" the Trinity (Introit), and God will show "mercy to us" (Offertory, Communion). On this Feast we should also renew our baptismal vows that this "profession of our faith... may be of profit to our health, in body and soul" (Postcommunion).-Excerpted from *My Sunday Missal*, Confraternity of the Precious Blood
