Message from Father Tom:

“if this endeavor or this activity is of human origin, it will destroy itself. But if it comes from God, you will not be able to destroy them; you may even find yourselves fighting against God.”
Acts 5:38-39

One of the big questions that Dr. Marmorstein proposes in his Early Church History class is how the early Church was able to survive. The Roman and Jewish authorities systematically killed almost every one of the leaders of the early Church. In almost every case we know of, this would be the end of an organization. So why did the Church survive?

In the Acts of the Apostles, Gamaliel proposes the answer-- things that are not of God will go away eventually; things that are of God, however, cannot be destroyed. If we were to try to destroy them, we would only be fighting against God. It is God himself who preserves the Church from destruction. God desires that is persist in the world.

During a frustrating argument with a Roman Catholic cardinal, Napoleon Bonaparte supposedly burst out: “Your eminence, are you not aware that I have the power to destroy the Catholic Church?” The cardinal, the anecdote goes, responded ruefully: “Your majesty, we, the Catholic clergy, have done our best to destroy the church for the last 1,800 years. We have not succeeded, and neither will you.”

The Church is not a human thing. It is wonderful, and at times strange. Let us not make the mistake of thinking that we can totally understand what God is trying to do in the Church; for it seems obvious that this endeavor is of Divine origin.

“Effective transmission (of faith) **requires more** than simply piling more and more religious content into children’s lives.

Successful religious transmission is **an act of parental self-communication, a sharing of something precious, a constitutive element of a parent’s sense of self.**

What parents say, do, and decide religiously, must, over the long run, transparently communicate their most precious religious convictions and values, such that by emerging adulthood, children no long see Catholicism merely as an abstract ideology or set of beliefs that can be critically accepted or rejected, but as something more intimate than that.”
