Message from Father Tom:

St. Peter's Basilica in Rome is an amazing piece of art. The first thing one notices is the incredible size which tends to magnify the sense of grandeur--"truly this feels like the house of God." But the other element is the beauty of the place. Everything is exquisitely crafted to the minutest detail. Yet, one beautiful piece of statuary fits into the larger structure of the whole building instead of overwhelming the other artwork. That incredible balance leaves one feeling that there is something "right" or "heavenly" about the place--"heaven must be something like this".

On the other end of the spectrum, I was walking the other day through Aberdeen and stopped for just a moment as a leaf from an elm tree caught my attention. Something about the sharp edges on the dark green leaf captured my imagination. It was so detailed, yet so simple at the same time. I couldn't help but feel that there was an incredible intentionality in what God did in creating this leaf. As a result I very naturally found myself praising the Lord and thanking Him for His goodness.

Something about beauty points us toward the infinite, the otherworldly, the things that can't be explained by mere words. Paintings, songs, the beauty of a child's face or even the way that things worked out, all seem to speak of something greater than us.

In truth, contemplating beauty can be one of the best gateways for people to come to true contemplative prayer. Almost everyone want to grow in prayer and they envy those who seem to be deep in contemplation in their prayer. Yet, the contemplation that we talk about in prayer is very closely tied to the experience of encountering beauty. For many, when they encounter something beautiful, it may capture their attention for a while; but they don't allow themselves to really dwell there with the beauty. True contemplatives recognize when they have encountered something beautiful, something divine, something holy--and they stop themselves from moving past it. This goes both for contemplating nature, and contemplating scripture.

This week, I want to invite you all to (1) notice something beautiful, (2) take time to appreciate it, and (3) thank God for the incredible chance to get in touch with the infinite.
