Message from Father Tom:

Some time ago I remember watching my nieces play on the living room carpet of my parents' house. They were having such a good time pretending they were puppies. In fact when their parents called out time for supper, they tried to eat their supper without their hands claiming, "I'm a puppy!" (Cont. above...)

(Cont.) Their parents, wisely, saw where this was going, the mess that might ensue, and they responded, "No, time to stop that. I love you but you are little girls and it's time to eat like girls."

We might laugh or think it to be cute if a child claimed to be a puppy, but we wouldn't treat it seriously. Once the time of play is over, a good parent will not change her reality to conform to the child's experience; instead, the parent will ask the child to conform to reality.

People have all sorts of thoughts and feelings that come and go in their own minds. Some of them conform to reality and some of them do not. One of the most pernicious of these mistaken thoughts is anorexia. A woman, now down to 70 lbs., might be convinced that she is fat and needs to lose weight. Should we choose to accept her reality, we would not be doing her any favors. We would, in fact be shirking our responsibility to help her be free of this psychosis. A more mature response would be to help dissuade her of this mistaken notion of reality.

Not long ago, Dr. Paul McHugh, the former psychiatrist in chief for John Hopkins Hospital, created waves. He said he thinks changing sexes is "biologically impossible", but also a "mental disorder". People such as this suffer from a "disorder of assumption" in believing they can choose their sex. People who do go through with a supposed sex reassignment surgery are 20 times more likely to commit suicide. Pride month is many things, but the general thrust is that we should accept the perception of people who say things like "I was born as a boy but I feel like a girl." Or, "I was born as a man, but I feel attracted to men." Today, the popular culture is asking reality—the actions and responses of Americans—to conform to their perception.

Although proponents of pride month may not realize it, Christians who hold to the traditional teaching about men's and women's identities; about men's and women's sexuality, are not being cruel. Instead these Christians are suggesting that LGBTQ people may be suffering from a mistaken perception of reality. And when people are suffering from a mistaken perception of reality, the adult thing to do is help them conform to reality. "I love you...but you are not a woman."

Part of the reason that Americans would rather not confront these problems is the same reason that parents don't want to confront their kids...we hate telling them there is something they cannot have. But Christ did not promise that every desire would be fulfilled in this world. The only thing the Lord promised us was the Cross. All of us Americans, especially Christians, must do a better job of dispelling the notion that we are entitled to every pleasure in this life. Some may not be able to marry. Some may not be happy with their bodies. That's life before the resurrection. We can't just tell this to others, we also have to live it ourselves. May the Lord grant us the courage to deny ourselves personally, and to challenge others to conform to reality, even if it is difficult.



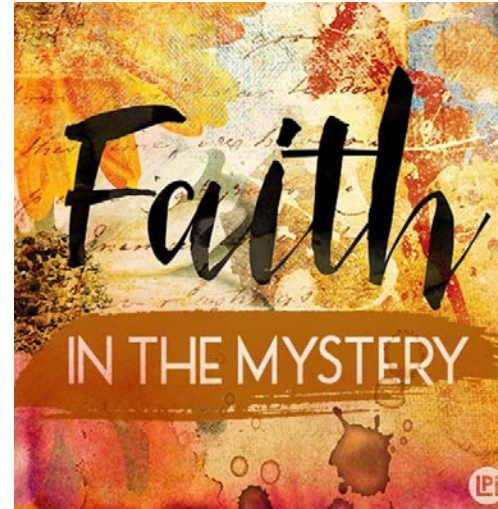
