When a priest is first ordained, people comment about the incredible sacrifice that is made to be a priest. After all, he has given up a certain companionship, family, and physical intimacy. Similar comments are made to married people (in a joking manner) about how they are taking on the proverbial "ball and chain". Both of these are true sacrifices.

Yet it is interesting to note that many of the hardest sacrifices come later in life. People are forced to accept physical/health limitations they never planned on. Others lost a child or the job that they thought they could depend upon.

It seems to me that, like the Widow from 1 Kings, God will challenge us when we feel that we have already given everything. It is at the point when we have already been generous that God asks us to give even more. Like the widow, we might say, "all I have is this little bit. You expect me to give this too?!?" The answer is yes. He expects every last bit.

But also, like the widow, the Lord will never let our sacrifice be in vain. The widow received a miracle: the flour did not run out or the oil run dry. She could continue to eat, even though she was giving away everything. Somehow, we must have faith that the Lord, our Heavenly Father truly cares for us enough to see us through. May the Lord grant that we can trust Him enough to give even the last little bit away.
