**Message from Father Tom:**

"At Easter, beloved brethren, it was the Lord's resurrection which was the cause of our joy; our present rejoicing is on account of his ascension into heaven." It is important to note that while Jesus "goes away from us" up into heaven, the point of the Ascension isn't that he has left us all alone. He is probably closer now than ever.

**First, after the Ascension, Christ is spiritually nearer to us than He was while on earth.** Through the Ascension, Jesus didn't take himself away from humanity, but actually took humanity with him to heaven, next to the Father. It is as if all of us are now in His throne room. This means that although Jesus is farther away in His humanity--we can't see Him the way the 12 apostles saw him--He is now much closer to us in His divinity: and we as human beings are closer to the divine than we ever were before.

Think about the way that we can turn to Jesus or the Father wherever we are--South Dakota, Israel, or San Francisco--and we can communicate with Him. Jesus reveals His will in our hearts, but also all around the world to ever people, every nation. His word continues to have power in us every time we hear it proclaimed. And so He is really very near to us all the time.

**Second, Christ's presence "ascends" into the Sacraments.** Although the divine presence of Jesus is all around us and is invisible, He didn't want us to be completely without sight. Now, "our Redeemer's visible presence has passed into the sacraments." When we come to mass, we can still see Christ with our visible eyes, under the veil of bread and wine. When we come to mass, we can peer into heaven and take part with all the angels and saints in adoring Him. What a gift!

Praise be our Lord Jesus Christ for Ascending with humanity to a higher plain of existence; now the divine world and the human world are closely and intimately linked!
