1. Try not to pack your summer with activities. Have you ever finished a summer, a vacation, or even just a day off, and thought "I am wore out. Now I need a rest from my time away". Leisure is difficult to come by these days. We feel like we need to be doing something even when we aren't required to do anything. Even really good things like baseball with the kids or attending a spiritual talk can become burdensome when our appointment book is packed full. We need to know our limits and practice saying no to things. Then, we will be working to live, not living to work.

2. Find a way to keep Sunday free. God has asked us to worship Him on Sunday around the community and to keep Sunday as a day of rest. Who are we to argue with that? Sunday is a blessed day because it is a time that we can carve out of our week just for being with God. Aside from that, it is God's gift to us to free us from the slavery of busyness. Parents, the times you go out of your way to get to mass while on vacation are the times that prove what you say to your kids about mass--don't miss the opportunity to show them.

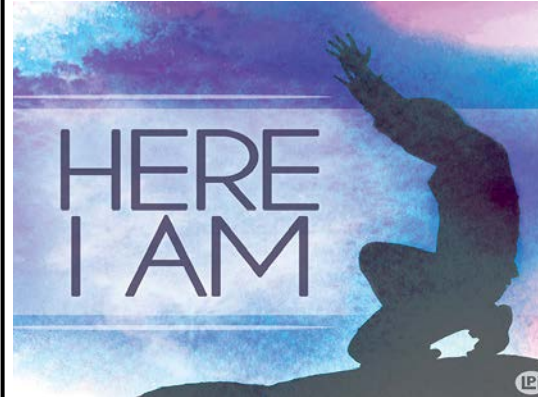

There is a story about a man named Bill who would stop in every day to the chapel where Jesus was in the Blessed Sacrament--the Eucharist. Bill would stop after work and say, "Hey Jesus, my friend, just wanted to be with you for a moment". Then he would leave. Or on the way to the kids' games, he would quickly stop in and say, "Hey Jesus, my friend, just wanted to catch you between things." He did this for years. Toward the end of his life, he developed cancer and was bed-ridden in the hospital. With his last breaths, he saw blazing countenance of Jesus coming toward him, who said, "Hey Bill, my friend, just wanted to be near you for a while." At Corpus Christi, we celebrate the presence of our Lord Jesus among us. We can take advantage of this gift at almost any time we have a free moment. Jesus would love to see you.
