Message from Father Tom:

[W]hen I met Jesus, it seemed as though life was rather like a bike, but it was a tandem bike, and I noticed that Jesus was in the back helping me pedal. I didn't know just when it was He suggested we change, but life has not been the same since I took the back-seat to Jesus, my Lord. He makes life exciting. When I had control, I thought I knew the way. It was rather boring, but predictable. It was the shortest distance between two points.

But when He took the lead, He knew delightful long cuts, up mountains, and through rocky places and at break-through speeds; it was all I could do to hang on! Even though it often looked like madness, He said, "Pedal!" I was worried and anxious and asked, "Where are you taking me?" He laughed and didn't answer and I started to learn to trust. I forgot my boring life and entered into adventure. And when I'd say, "I'm scared", He'd lean back and touch my hand.

He took me to people with gifts that I needed, gifts of healing, acceptance and joy. They gave me their gifts to take on my journey, our journey, my Lord's and mine. And we were off again. He said, "Give the gifts away; they're extra baggage, too much weight." So I did, to the people we met, and I found in giving I received, and still our burden was light.

I did not trust Him, at first, in control of my life. I thought He'd wreck it, but He knows bike secrets, knows how to make it bend to take sharp corners, jump to clear high rocks, fly to shorten scary passages. And I am learning to shut up and pedal in the strangest places, and I'm beginning to enjoy the view and the cool breeze on my face with my delightful constant companion, Jesus. And when I'm sure I just can't do any more, He just smiles and says... "Pedal." (Author unknown)

There are two ways to live in life. One way is we can spend our time trying to wrestle control away from God. But even if we manage to take control of our lives and steer it the direction we want; this way is predictable, boring, and frankly, doesn't always get us where we truly want to go.

On the other hand, we can live our lives according to the Spirit. We can let Jesus take control of where we go. This way is more frightening at first, because we aren't fully sure if the Lord can be trusted with control. "What if I don't have enough when I give this away?" "What if everything crashes down around us?" "What if I have to suffer greatly?" In the long run you come to see that even if these things happen, the Lord has a reason; and He brings us out on the other side. If we live by the Spirit, we will definitely get to our desired destination...because God knows the way!

Brothers and sisters in Christ, don't be afraid to let Jesus take control. Don't be afraid to live by the Spirit.
