Message from Father Tom:

Corpus Christi--the name of the feast we celebrate today--literally means "Body of Christ". In other words, we commemorate and rejoice over the fact that the Son of God, Jesus Christ took a body (filled with blood) and then, **He made His body and blood accessible to us in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.** But, now that we have this Body and Blood of our Lord, what do we do with it?

1. We can adore Jesus in It. Do you ever get the sense that there is someone there when you walk into Church? Because Jesus is actually present in the tabernacles of the Catholic churches around the world, many people do get that sense coming to their church. When Moses walked on holy ground near a burning bush, he was told to remove his shoes. How much more we should drop to our knees in the presence of God Himself. When we honor the Body and Blood of Christ we can't help but start to worship...this is how Eucharistic adoration gets started in many parishes.

2. We can offer this Body and Blood to God. What gift would you give the one who you loved more than any other? What would you give to the one to whom you owed everything? God our Father is this One. We would want to offer the best possible gift. In the old testament, it was the blood of a goat, but as Saint Paul says so well: "if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer's ashes can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works". We offer the best gift now; we offer the Body and Blood of the Son of God.

3. Now that we have such an amazing blessing, we can even show it off a little bit. In our procession around the town, we show off the fact that we have a God among us. We lift Him high in the Monstrance (the sun-shaped holder for the Eucharist) and display Him for all the world to see. Now *that* is something to brag about.

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) June 3, 2018



Why the Procession on Corpus Christi – Spiritual Fruits

(an excerpt from the National Catholic Register, June 2017)

After the Mass and procession, Archbishop Blair from Hartford, Connecticut reflected on meanings and aspects of the day, the message of adoration and reverence for the Blessed Sacrament not only on Corpus Christi but all the time. He shared three main insights with the Register.

First, this celebration and procession teaches us "to be always prayerful, attentive, and meditative in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament," he said.

Second, it reminds us, "We are the Body of Christ, and therefore we also see him in our neighbor... the Eucharist embraces all of us."

Third, it also highlights a public aspect. Archbishop Blair described how as he carried the most Blessed Sacrament "so close, I thought the eyes of Jesus are seeing the world in our streets. He is present to us. What a beautiful thing."

Archbishop Blair added, "He is always present in the world. The procession reminds us he is present in the world" and interested in our joys, sorrows, and blessing.

Here was Jesus body, blood, soul and divinity under the appearances of bread, the host, walking through the streets.
