Message from Father Tom:

Although my four months in Italy were some of the most enjoyable in my life, when we got off the plane in NJ in early June, I kissed the ground. I had never appreciated the blessings of America so much as right then. The efficiency, the cleanliness, the open spaces--at least in most parts of America--were such great blessings.

Honoring our native land is much like honoring our father and mother. For all its faults, this great nation has brought us up, kept us safe, protected our rights, and tried to make society right for us. Even though the United States is not perfect, it has done some things very well for us. Just like a family, the nation is not perfect; yet it has given us so much. Thus, failing to honor our nation is a failure to keep the 4th commandment to honor our father and mother.

But to truly honor and love our parents sometimes means saying difficult things to them. Ask any man who has had to take the keys away from his nearly-blind father. Our nation is no different. Sometimes it is the very love of our nation that drives us to challenge its assumptions and biases and see things from a bigger point of view. In recent years we’ve been called upon to do exactly that. Our great motherland has occasionally forgotten that God is Lord over all. It is part of our task to remind her.

Prayer to the Virgin Mary: Mary, Holy Virgin Mother, I have received your Son, Jesus Christ. With love you became his mother, gave birth to him, nursed him, and helped him grow to manhood. With love, I return Him to you, to hold once more, to love with all your heart, and to offer to the Holy Trinity as our supreme act of worship for your honor and for the food of all your pilgrim brothers and sisters.

Prayer to St. Joseph: Remember, most pure husband of Mary ever virgin, my loving protector Joseph, that never has it been heard that anyone who invoked your protection or asked aid of you has not be consoled. 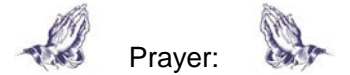
