Message from Father Tom:

About a month ago the parish council voted to move forward with a campus renewal project. This project is exciting because it will accomplish several important things:

First, a new rectory will be built: with current construction standards, better efficiency, and--most importantly--accessibility for any elderly priests that may live at the parish in the future. Secondly, a drop-off lane right next to the handicapped ramp, along with about 10 more handicapped parking spots will greatly reduce the walking distance for our elderly parishioners. Those of you with lower mobility will love this portion of the plan!

Although it was never our intention to keep this information from anyone (I have always explained the project openly to anyone who has asked); still, I know that for some of you the project is "fuzzy", it's hard to see. The trouble with big projects like these, is that it is hard to communicate what will happen--with words. Until one sees it, it's always a little fuzzy in one's mind.

Because of this, **we will soon be inviting you all to a variety of "town-hall" style meetings.** At these meetings, you will each have the opportunity to see the plans laid out visually, and then ask questions and make comments about this plan. Also, we will have further updates and details in the bulletin.

The parish council and myself have prayed long and hard about this; and we have come to believe that this is right. I can't wait for you all to see it too!

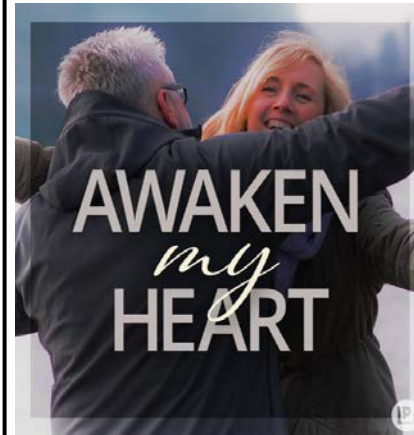
