Message from Father Tom:

"Little ones, let no one deceive you; the man who acts in holiness is holy indeed, even as the Son is holy...No one whose actions are unholy belongs to God, nor anyone who fails to love his brother." -1 John 3

In the past 30 years pop psychology has tried to see the mantra, "I'm OK, you're OK". People lie on a couch and they are told "do what feels good," and "you shouldn't feel guilt for that!" or "you deserve it!"

In one parable of the Lord there were some people who died and faced judgement. Christ, as Lord of all things, divides them some on his right and some on his left. Those on His right He judges worthy of heaven for the good things that they have done in service to others, and the way they have avoided evil. But to those on his left He says, "depart from me you wicked to the eternal fire; for I was hungry and you did not feed me, I was naked and you gave me no clothing." And they wailed and claimed that they didn't know their actions would have consequences.

Saint John (quoted above) wrote his first letter to make several points. (1) Christ really has risen. (2) Christ really does care what you do with yourselves. In other words, we do not belong to God if we don't pay attention to the commandments He has given us. We're not OK. We can't just do whatever feels good. We certainly don't deserve it: all is gift. May the Lord help up to be obedient to the risen and ascended Christ--to act in holiness and be holy indeed!
