Message from Father Tom:

Elijah stood on top of Mount Horeb in the midst of a
horrendous storm. The lightning crashed; but the Lord was not
in the lightning. An earthquake shattered the rocks; but the
Lord wasn't in the earthquake. The winds pushed over trees;
but the Lord wasn't in the wind. Finally, Elijah heard a gentle
whisper; and he fell to his knees and said, "Speak Lord, your
servant is listening."

Down at the Broom Tree retreat center, there is a little
embroidered cloth on the altar that says, "In the silence, God
speaks". We shouldn't suppose that God stops speaking when
there is noise: that's not the case. But it is true again and again
that the noise makes things harder for us to become aware of
the constant voice of the Lord.

Occasionally, in order to win a war, an army will have to make
a strategic retreat. And you can bet that occasionally, in order
for us to win our spiritual war, we too need to make retreats
into silence and reflection. They can be long retreats--I once
made a 30 day silent retreat--or they can be as short as an
hour spent in the Church to gather our courage and strength
again.

I want to encourage you all to find a retreat to go on this year.
We all need the time away to gather spiritual strength, and to
listen to the voice of God. Between Broom Tree and the Abbey
of the Hills, there are some great opportunities for people in
our region. Find a couple moments to listen for God...for in the
silence, God speaks.
