Message from Father Tom:

Last week we had the wonderful reading about Mary and Martha. Martha, burdened with much serving, asked the Lord to tell Mary to help her. Jesus response is that Mary has chosen the better part.

People get very indignant about this reading: they feel that they are unappreciated in their hard work. While I can understand their sentiments, we can't dismiss Christ's words because they make us uncomfortable. Jesus is not saying that hard work and service are unimportant...we can see they are important to the Lord by all the other passages where he advises us to serve.

Instead He is pointing to a very important principle. Namely, all this serving will pass away. All this stuff that you are concerned about passes away. Only one thing remains. Only one thing is worth putting your whole self into because it is eternal. That one thing is the thing that Mary discovered: the person of Jesus Christ. She discovered that of all the things that we can concern ourselves with, only heavenly things endure. In other words, if we are going to "invest" our time, our talents, our treasures, what better return can we get than investing in the things of heaven?

Many people realize this as we get older in life. Everything that we care about gets taken from us except this one thing. That's the thing that we want to spend time on. That's the "ONE THING" that Jesus advises us to put energy into. May God grant that we don't lose sight of the one thing.
