Message from Father Tom:

I am fascinated by time. We try to count out each
moment...but time has a way of alluding any attempt to grasp
it too tightly. Albert Einstein once famously said, "Put your
hand on a hot stove for a minute, and it seems like an hour.
Sit with a pretty girl for an hour, and it seems like a minute.
That's relativity."

In Greek there are two words for time. First there is
Chronos, a word that corresponds closely to precise,
measured and counted time. We might ask if the Chronos-
time is right to start the mass: is it 8:30a? On the other hand
there is Kyros time, a word which is more about the proper or
appropriate moment. We might ask if the Kyros-time is right
to start mass: is the chalice ready? Are the families all with
us? Are the altar servers settled down?

We are often very concerned about the Chronos time, the
time that is on our watches or cell phones. However, true
wisdom is about doing the right things at the right times. For
example, with children we may ask, "is it the time to punish or
the time to look past what they did?" In the book of
Ecclesiastes, the author Solomon comments on how there is
a proper time for everything:

A time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and
a time to uproot the plant.

A time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to tear down,
and a time to build.

A time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn,
and a time to dance.

A time to scatter stones, and a time to gather them; a
time to embrace, and a time to be far from embraces.

A time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and
a time to cast away.

A time to mend, and a time to sew; a time to be silent,
and a time to speak.

A time to love, and a time to hate; a time of war, and a
time of peace.

There is a proper time for one thing and a proper time for
the other. It is through prayer that we will know the difference.
Let us pray that God will show us the proper time--the Kyros
for each and every moment.

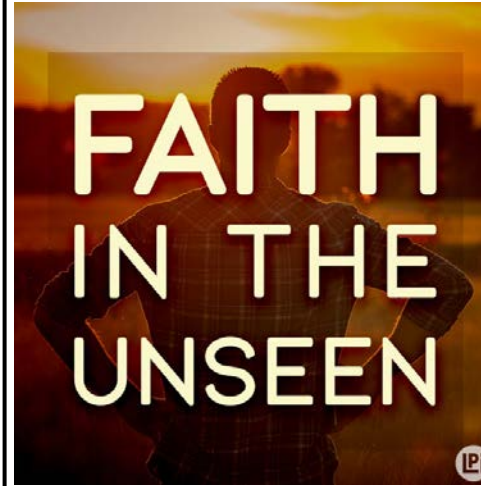
