Message from Father Tom:

The last few weeks, we have been hearing from the wonderful sixth chapter of the Gospel of St. John. In these weeks, we have used these passages to answer the question, “Why do we have to go to mass?” I thought I would take this opportunity to review some of where we have been:

1. We go to mass because **God has called us together into one people.** Gathering around the altar of the Church is a statement of unity with all the others who gather around the altars all around the world. As one man famously said, “if I don’t go to mass on Sunday, I forget who I am”. And we are a people set apart from the rest of the world for His glory! We are Catholics.
2. We go to mass because there **we get strength for our journey.** Jesus says, “Unless you eat my flesh and drink my blood you have no life within you.” But, receiving the Eucharist, we have life both for our coming week and the struggles we will face; and also for eternity.
3. We go to mass because at mass **we are taught by God.** The Lord promised we would be taught by God. Unlike out hunting, or at home, when we are at Church we hear the words that God has revealed to the world. Furthermore, we receive the authentic interpretation of these words by the Church’s minister.
4. We go to mass because **there we can finally offer a worthy gift to God.** God has done so much for us...and He continues to do so much for us. We are out of exchange. We can’t give Him anything that comes close to repaying Him. However, the Lord Himself has given us the perfect gift to offer to the Father--we can offer Him his Son! Every mass we give the Father a gift that He *loves*. We give His Son.
5. Finally, we go to mass because **Jesus is present -- Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.** As weird as it may seem, Jesus gives himself to us in the form of bread and wine. Some find this preposterous, and they turn away from Him. But we acknowledge that Christ is present here like He is nowhere else. “Where else should we go, Lord? We have come to believe that you are the Christ.” Indeed, where else would we want to be, but by Him?

Rosary in Thanksgiving for the wonderful rain received and for favorable weather for the rest of the year will be said at 8am in Zell prior to Mass on Wednesday morning.
