Message from Father Tom:

Sometimes people get the impression that religious brothers or sisters are without passion or "bland sauce". My experience has always been quite the opposite. As a matter of fact, the passion that they have is so great that it becomes all consuming...in a good way.

At some point along the way, a young man or woman has an encounter with the living God--maybe through prayer in the Church, or maybe as they receive the mercy of Jesus in confession. When that happens, they start to hunger for it. They decide that they would sacrifice any worldly good to have it. They have found the proverbial "pearl of great price". And in order to obtain this incredible pearl always and forever, they forsake spouse and children (the vow of chastity), they forsake wealth and pleasure (the vow of poverty); and they forsake power and personal preference (the vow of obedience).

These faithful men and women witness to the fact that not only is God enough to make us happy, but also that God's love is better than any other happiness possible on this earth. You might recall the story of Mary and Martha. Martha was anxious and worried about many things, while Mary forsook all of those things, preferring to remain close to Christ. When we have to clean the dishes, or the bills are due, is there not a part of us that realizes Jesus was right to say Mary "has chosen the better part"?

I, for one, am sorry that we don't have as many religious brothers and sisters around as was the case in the past. Every time that I am near one of these dedicated nuns or monks I am inspired by how much he or she is willing to sacrifice in order to be near Him, whom all our hearts should love and adore. I am reminded of how weak my love is, by comparison. I am reminded that it is possible (and blessed) to give up my own will, my own comforts for the sake of others.

Let's pray that the Lord grant a resurgence of vocations to the consecrated religious life. For, we need their example of generosity and sacrificial love of God.
