Message from Father Tom:

'A violent squall came up and waves were breaking over the boat, so that it was already filling up. Jesus was in the stern, asleep on a cushion. They woke him and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Quiet! Be still!" The wind ceased and there was great calm. Then he asked them, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?"'

-Mark 4:37-40

Saint John Chrysostom was an amazing saint from the 4th to 5th Century in the Byzantine Roman Empire (which would today be Istanbul & Turkey). He was such an amazing homilist and teacher that he was called "Chrysostom", a name meaning "golden-mouth". He was never a fair-weather Christian; and there were many "storms" brewing around St. John in his time. St. John Chrysostom would proclaim the truth of Christ even when it chafed the Empress and her court. It was said about Saint John, "he fears neither torture, nor banishment, nor even death...the only thing that he fears is sin."

How could St. John be so calm in the midst of the wind and the waves rising around him? He knew the Lord of the sea. He knew the Lord of the winds and storms. No matter what happened around him, he knew Jesus the Lord.

When we are tempted to ask the Lord, "don't you care that we are perishing?" it's good to remember Jesus' response to his disciples: "Do you not yet have faith?"

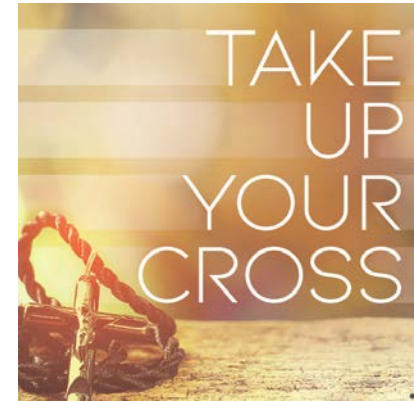

Feast of St. Matthew – September 21st.

At the time that Jesus summoned him to follow Him, Matthew was a publican, that is, a tax-collector for the Romans. His profession was hateful to the Jews because it reminded them of their subjection; the publican, also, was regarded by the pharisees as the typical sinner. St. Matthew is known to us principally as an Evangelist. He was the first to put down in writing our Lord's teaching and the account of His life. His Gospel was written in Aramaic, the language that our Lord Himself spoke.
