Message from Father Tom:

"Of the approximately 70,000 exorcisms he has carried out, Father Gabriele Amorth estimates that fewer than 100 have been cases of genuine demonic possession.

The chief exorcist of the diocese of Rome quotes this second figure as if to comfort me, but to a modern Catholic convinced that the Devil is just a face the church has traditionally put to the otherwise intangible presence of evil in the world, 100 sounds like an awful lot of encounters with someone I don't believe exists. I want to ask if he is absolutely sure he wasn't mistaken in those 100 cases, but everything about the manner of this burly, pugnacious priest, in his mid-80s and with a deeply-lined bulldog face, makes plain he means every single word.

Recently there was a movie out called "The Rite" starring Anthony Hopkins among others. In the movie there was a second and younger priest. A few years back, we priests of Eastern South Dakota were able to meet with the very priest that this movie was based upon--Father Gary Thomas. Father Gary is an exorcist from a diocese in California.

There are many things that I have taken away from that day. But for you, here are some of the main things: **First, the devil and evil spirits do indeed exist.** They don't want you to believe in them because to believe in them is to believe more fully in God. As an 18th century poet once said, "The Devil's deepest wile is to persuade us that he does not exist."

Second, you need not be afraid. The Devil and other demons have already been conquered by Christ's victory on the Cross. Of course we should have a healthy respect for the demons because they are powerful. Yet, the battle between Our Lord Jesus and the Devil is not an equal fight. Christ is God. The Devil is only a creature that God created. What happens in cases of demonic influence, only happens because God allows it for His glory.

Third, keep in mind that the solution to almost every case of demonic influence, is a regular regimen of 1. Prayer 2. Faith 3. Sacraments and 4. Morality (right living). If we are getting to confession regularly, praying, and forgiving others; evil spirits will have little hold on us.
