Message from Father Tom:

In the order of creation, there are many things that are earthly,
and really have no spiritual ties. For example, there are
stones, or air, or even the grass that we mow every week.
These things are entirely of this world, this universe. On the
other hand, there are some in God's creation that are
completely spiritual. The angels have no physical or worldly
matter--they are entirely spiritual beings, so it makes little
sense to ask how big they are, or even *where* they are. Unlike
either, we humans possess a middle ground--we are both
matter and spirit, we are both earthly and heavenly, we need
sustenance for our bodies, and sustenance for our souls.

In relation to our humanity, we can fall into two
opposite errors. The first, an seemingly more common error,
is to forget our spiritual nature. Many in our world act as if we
are nothing but eating, reproducing beings. It is true we are
beasts. Yet for these people, we are nothing more.

The other error is to forget our earthly, bodily nature.
It was told of Abbot John the Dwarf that once he had said to
his elder brother: "I want to live in the same security as the
angels have, doing no work, but serving God without
intermission." And casting off everything he had on, he started
out into the desert. When a week had gone by he returned to
his brother. And while he was knocking on the door, his
brother called out before opening, and asked: "Who are you?"
He replied: "I am John." Then his brother answered and said,
"John has become an angel and is no longer among men...If
you are a man, you are going to have to start working again in
order to live...."

Most of us realize that we need to eat and work to be
able to pray. Yet, we too sometimes act like we think we are
angels, and the bodies needs don't matter to the soul. Will we
be more charitable to co-workers after staying up to finish the
game, or after a good night of sleep? Will we be able to pray
better sitting in our recliner, or kneeling by our beds? Will we
remember the Lord better if our house is modern art deco, or
if we have religious art on the walls? Will we praise God better
at mass by checking our phones or by singing at the top of our
lungs? Will we hunger more for the Eucharist after a big
breakfast or after fasting all morning? Will Sunday be special
if it is just like every other day, or if the kids get a surprise
dessert?

Many of our Catholic traditions are attempts to involve
both the soul *and* the body. Let us praise God with the depth
of our souls, and the entirety of our bodies.

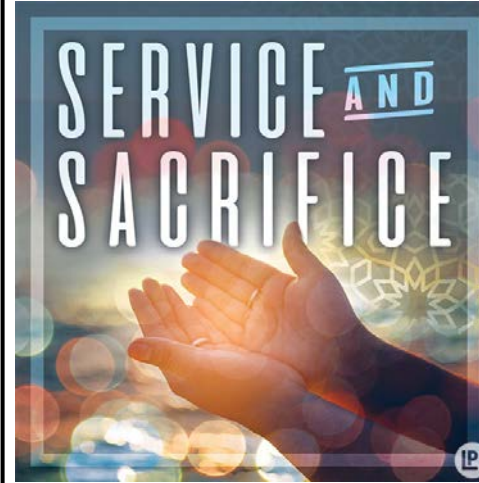
