The Seven Sorrows (or *Dolors*) are events in the life of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

1. At the prophecy of Simeon: "You yourself shall be pierced with a sword-so that the thoughts of many hearts may be laid bare." (Lk 2:35).
2. At the flight into Egypt: "Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt." (Mt 2:13)
3. Having lost the Holy Child at Jerusalem; "You see that your father and I have been searching for you in sorrow." (Luke 2:48)
4. Meeting Jesus on his way to Calvary
5. Standing at the foot of the Cross; "Near the cross of Jesus there stood His mother." (John 19:25)
6. Jesus being taken from the Cross;
7. At the burial of Christ.

It is a common practice for Catholics to say daily one Our Father and seven Hail Mary's for each sorrow. Blessed Mary, pray for us!

**Message from Father Tom:**

"I'm personally opposed but..."

Frequently today we hear about politicians who profess to be Catholic but their beliefs don't seem to inform their beliefs or actions. The impression that we get (regarding pro-life for example) is that they don't care enough about their faith, or about the babies in the womb to actually stand for them. Likewise, they don't care enough about the death penalty to actually act to limit it. People such as this don't act on their beliefs; and we wonder if they really believe them.

How different they are than St. John the Baptist! The Baptist realized that King Herod was living in an improper situation with another man's wife. Instead of staying quiet about his beliefs, he said something. Instead of offering the classic line, "I'm personally opposed but..." he instead said to Herod that it was not right for him to be living with his brother's wife. Instead of the safety of remaining quiet, he boldly spoke from his convictions.

I say this knowing how difficult it is for all of us to follow his great example. How easy it is for you and I to stay quiet when we know there has been sexual abuse in the Church, or we know about people drinking too much, or we know someone is perpetually missing out on his spiritual life. In most of these cases, we want to be like the baptist, but we fall short. We want to express the Truth; but we fail to do or say anything.

Our beliefs are supposed to be expressed in public ways. If we care about our faith and about the world, the faith will necessarily become a part of how we act. If we care enough about our State, our Nation, our World, then we will put our values into action to bring about a better society. If we care about babies, or immigrants, or victims of abuse, or students in schools...then we will express our beliefs by ACTION.

**We have a duty to see that our beliefs inform our actions.** It is possible that in our effort to bring about a more just and holy world, our beliefs may bring us derision or even suffering; but this is no more than has already happened to the great saints. St. John the Baptist, pray for us!
